RE: Emergency Medical Services

Dear Citizens:

The Corsicana Fire Department has been providing ambulance service to the residents of Corsicana and Navarro County since 2002. The department currently responds to approximately 6,400 emergency and non-emergency medical calls per year. This service is provided utilizing firefighters that are trained and certified at the paramedic level through the Texas Department of State Health Services. This certification allows EMS personnel to provide an **Advanced Level of Care** to patients with serious injuries or illnesses. The department operates four frontline ambulances with two additional reserve ambulances available too be placed into service as needed.

The City offers an **EMS Subscription Program** to the residents of Corsicana and Navarro County that can potentially save money if you or your family members that are covered under the program need an ambulance. Coverage is provided for you, your spouse and your children under 25 years of age that are living at a single residence. This program is offered for an annual fee of \$48.00.

To join the EMS Subscription Program for the period of October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018, please fill out an application form and submit a check for \$48.00 to the Corsicana Fire Department, 200 N. 12th Street, Corsicana Texas 75110 by September 30, 2017. Application for membership made after September 30, 2017, will be prorated at a cost of \$4.00 per month. Corsicana residents that have water service with the City of Corsicana Water Department may pay this fee in monthly installments of \$4.00 on each month's water bill. EMS subscription applications can be obtained at the Corsicana Fire Department, or by calling 903-654-4956 for county locations.
